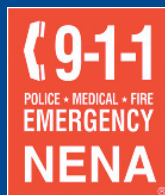

CONGRESSIONAL E9-1-1 CAUCUS

The Congressional E9-1-1 Caucus was established in February 2003, by Senator Conrad Burns (R-MT), Senator Hillary Clinton (D-NY), Representative John Shimkus (R-IL) and Representative Anna Eshoo (D-CA). The purpose of the Caucus is to promote the importance of emergency communications and enhanced 9-1-1 services. The Caucus works to advance E9-1-1 services by educating policy makers on the importance of E9-1-1 and ensure that E9-1-1 systems, networks and operators are adequately funded.

E9-1-1 INSTITUTE

The E9-1-1 Institute is a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) organization working with the Congressional E9-1-1 Caucus to promote strong, more capable 9-1-1 services and emergency communications. The Institute assists the Caucus in promoting public education on E9-1-1 and emergency communication issues by:

- 1) serving as an information clearinghouse on E9-1-1 and emergency communication issues; and
