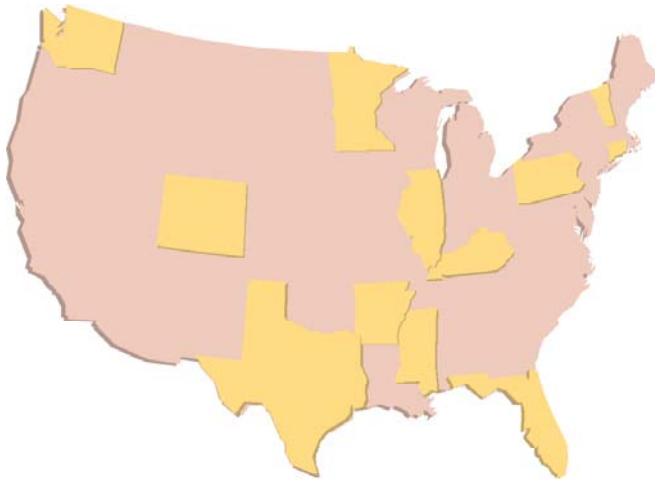

Authority	Implementation	Description*
Arkansas	Business	Any exchange telephone service provider is required to send telephone number and street address to the PSAP.
Colorado	Business	Any multi-line telephone system operator who does not provide the local PSAP with location information needs to educate and provide documentation to their employees on dialing 911.
Connecticut	Business	Companies can not prevent a 911 call from being made. However, they can have them directed to on-site answering points.
Florida	Business	Any PBX installed after 1/1/2004 needs to be capable of providing automatic location identification to the station level.
Illinois	Business	Any business providing a private business switch service needs to provide the location information if over 40,000 ft ² down to the extension location. If under, provide building address.
Kentucky	Residential Only	Any dispersed private telephone system (including hotels/motels) must be able to transmit the station information for each specific station on the switch.
Minnesota	Business	Any PBX installed after 1/1/2004 needs to be capable of providing automatic location identification to the station level.
Mississippi	Business	Any business needs to provide the PSAP with the location of any extension when it connects to 911, wherever Enhanced 911 is in operation.
Texas	Residential Only Businesses—Tarrant County	Businesses providing residential telephone services must provide location information. Tarrant County also requires businesses to comply.
Vermont	Business	Businesses operating a privately owned telephone system need to provide the station identification data and updates to the 911 database.
Washington	Business	Businesses occupying over 25,000 ft ² , more than one floor or multiple buildings need to provide automatic location identification for each telephone in a format compatible with the local 911 system.
